3. Stockton East Water District – 2022 Cost Allocation Study

a. Public Hearing

President Watkins opened the Public Hearing at 12:32 p.m., to receive input on the 2022 Cost Allocation Study.

Manager Hopkins reported the cost allocation process is required per the 2001 Settlement Agreement with the Urban Contractors. Manager Hopkins reported the District hired an outside Consultant to develop the allocation of the District Administrative costs for Agriculture and M&I. Manager Hopkins reported the Cost Allocation Study was distributed to the Urban Contractors, provided a 30-day comment period and received no comments. The 2022 Cost Allocation Study and Resolution are presented to the Board for consideration of adoption and implementation in this

Fiscal Year. President Watkins clarified implementation in the current District Fiscal Year 2022-23.

Seeing there were no public comments, President Watkins closed the Public Hearing at 12:34 p.m.

1. ACWA Groundwater Sub-Committee Meeting, 08/16/22

This item was for information only.

2. San Joaquin County Flood Control and Water Advisory Commission Meeting, 08/17/22

Director McGurk attended the August 17, 2022 San Joaquin County Flood Control and Water Advisory Commission Meeting. Director McGurk reported Steven Shih, San Joaquin County Environmental Health Department gave an overview of the well permitting process. Director McGurk reported Condor Earth was retained to develop a criteria checklist which will be published soon. President Watkins reported the County distributed an email yesterday and they will be holding a workshop regarding the review criteria on Monday, September 12, 2022 at 10:00 a.m., at the Hazelton Avenue office location. Director McGurk reported an update was given on the American River and Mokelumne River Water Rights. Director McGurk reported the Mokelumne River Water Right could provide 40,000-60,000 acre-feet to be put to beneficial use. Dante Nomellini is working with East Bay Municipal Utilities District and is also trying to recruit Woodbridge Irrigation District in the process. Director McGurk reported an update was given on flood management and a Flood Ordinance handout was provided from SJAFCA. Director McGurk reported San Joaquin County Supervisor Winn reported out on current efforts of the five Delta Counties, providing presentations of alternatives to the Tunnels. The five Delta Counties have plans to talk to the MET and have also met with Kern and Fresno counties to push alternatives, one of the alternatives being Delta Louvers. Director Panizza inquired if Director McGurk can provide the alternatives handout to Manager Hopkins to provide to the Directors and District staff as appropriate. The next meeting is scheduled for September 21, 2022.

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 08/15/22

Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 75,195 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 251 cfs. Current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River are set at 250 cfs and release to all water users are set at 0 cfs. There are 22 irrigators on New Hogan, 0 irrigators on New Melones, and 0 irrigators out of District. The water treatment plant is currently processing 48 mgd. The City of Stockton is currently processing 17 mgd. Manager Hopkins reported the District wells total water extraction is 6,672 gpm (~9.6 mgd).

Director Cortopassi inquired on how much of the New Hogan water supply is going to the Water Treatment Plant and what the storage level at New Hogan will be by December. Director Sanguinetti replied it would be ~1,000 acre-feet a week. Manager Hopkins added at the end of the irrigation season storage at New Hogan should be about 55,000-60,000 acre-feet (mid-October). President Watkins added the District will also have 1,000 acre-feet coming from Salt Springs.

3. Report on General Manager Activities

a. Mokelumne River Water and Power Authority Solicitation of Project Partners Meeting, 08/19/22
Director Watkins and Manager Hopkins attended the August 19, 2022 Mokelumne River Water and Power Authority Solicitation of Project Partners Meeting. Manager Hopkins reported a follow-up meeting will be scheduled to determine how to move forward and how much water would be available. Additionally, Stockton East Water District, North San Joaquin Water Conservation District, San Joaquin County and the City of Stockton will get together to draft a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

b. Central Valley Project Water Association – Executive & Financial Affairs Committee Meeting, 08/19/22

Accountant Ram attended the August 19, 2022 Central Valley Project Water Association – Executive & Financial Affairs Committee Meeting. Accountant Ram reported a presentation was given on Rate Setting – Rate Development. The next meeting is scheduled for September 16, 2022.

c. Stockton Area Water Suppliers (SAWS) Meeting, 08/19/22

Manager Hopkins attended the August 19, 2022 Stockton Area Water Suppliers (SAWS) meeting. Manager Hopkins reported joining shortly before it ended and discussion was on agenda item 1, public outreach efforts. Manager Hopkins reported a Committee to be formed by the conservation staff of each agency that will be chaired by Water Conservation Coordinator Kristin Coon. Manager Hopkins reported the City of Stockton reported receiving an increase of transfer water from Woodbridge Irrigation District. The next meeting is scheduled for September 9, 2022.

d. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Manager Hopkins reported North San Joaquin Water Conservation District has requested to convene the Eastern Water Alliance (EWA) to hold a joint EWA and Monitoring Committee Meeting. Manager Hopkins reported staff will forward the email to the EWA members.

Manager Hopkins reported the County released a Call for Projects to be included in the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Sustainable Plan and will take project ideas from the Board/ work with District staff for potential project submittals.

Background

Recent and lengthy internet outages have highlighted the need to establish a second internet connection to the Stockton East Water District's (District) Water Treatment Plant. Previously, there were no viable options available at this location to provide a secondary path.

ZeroOutages, a subsidiary of Xroads Networks has now developed hardware and software that allows it to offer StarLink, which began deployment of a communication satellite network in 2019, to businesses as a primary or secondary internet path. The installation would consist of a rooftop antenna on the Operations Building that would track and lock onto the StarLink satellite network, a StarLink controller for powering the antenna, and a Router / SD-WAN device that would allow seamless path sharing between our existing fiber and the StarLink satellite network. Any future failure of AT&T fiber would result in the StarLink path being used, so internet and phone service would continue without interruption.

Summary

A second internet path has long been a goal of the District. This ZeroOutages StarLink solution will provide our needed secondary internet path at a reasonable cost. The contract requires a one-year commitment and automatically rolls into a month-to-month contract thereafter.

Financial Impact

Initial installation cost is approximately \$1,150 (installation, including an antenna pipe mount), with a monthly fee of \$345 (x12 = \$4140), for a total of \$5290. Subsequent yearly cost will be \$4,140.00. Current 22-23 fiscal year budgeted amount for the establishment of a second internet path is \$20,000.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to enter into a service agreement with ZeroOutages to establish Internet service with ZeroOutages - StarLink and one year of service; and make all other necessary approvals.

Re: Low Lift Pumping Station Slide Gate Replacements and Automation

Background

As a part of the Stockton East Water District’s (District) FY 22-23 budget, the Board of Directors (Board) approved a \$300,000 budget to replace the original Low Lift Pumping Station (LLPS) intake slide gates. There are two intake slide gates (60-inch and 48-inch) that allow water to flow into the low lift pump station from the Intake Raw Water Reservoir and the South Raw Water Reservoir. Neither slide gate seals when closed.

Summary

The initial budgeted project for \$300,000 was to include a large concrete flow splitter box with multiple slide gates and an area to install a future mechanical bar or perforated plate screen. After value engineering, it was decided to replace the two existing slide gates at the same location without building a separate structure outside of the LLPS.

Staff received three vendor quotes (Table 1) for two slide gates with electric actuators. The existing slide gates are Rodney Hunt. With an estimated lead time of 25 weeks, the Rodney Hunt slide gates and actuators could be installed this fiscal year and within the low flow demand winter period of the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) since this will require a WTP shutdown.

District staff recommends purchasing the Rodney Hunt slide gates and electric actuators and recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to proceed with the purchase of the LLPS slide gates and actuators for \$78,895, plus a 10% contingency of \$7,890, for a total cost of \$86,785.

Re: Administrative Cost Allocation Study

Background

As part of the 2001 Settlement Agreement between Stockton East Water District (the District), and the Urban Contractors (UCs), the cost allocation evaluation for all administrative and general expenses is required to be completed every five years; prior to approval and adoption via public hearing, the study must be shared with the UCs for their review and comments. No comments were received from the UCs or the public during review of the 2022-2023 Administrative Cost Allocation Study.

The 2005-2006 Administrative Cost Allocation Study was performed and adopted by in-house staff with an aggregate administrative cost allocation of 88% to the Municipal and Industrial Division (M&I) and of 12% to Agricultural Division (AG). The 2013-2014 Administrative Cost Allocation Study was, again, performed by in-house staff using the best available methods. The percentage results of the latter 2013-2014 study ended up being very similar to the percentages of the 2005-2006 study. As a result, when adopting the 2013-2014 study, the Board of Directors decided to retain the percentages previously adopted in the 2005-2006 study.

Summary

In an effort develop a more comprehensive cost allocation methodology for its 2022-2023 Administrative Cost Allocation Study, the District contracted with Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. (Raftelis). With the help of district staff and district counsel, Raftelis employed various methods in constructing its allocation including: analyzing five years of expense data, reviewing board minutes, and utilizing audited financial figures, among others, to come up with allocations for each line item in the Administrative Division budget. The 2022-2023 study concluded with an aggregate cost allocation rate of 87% of costs shared by M&I and 13% shared by AG.

Financial Impact

The total cost of the 2022-2023 Administrative Cost Allocation Study was \$67,586. This included cost of district counsel's time, staff time and the cost of engaging Raftelis.

As previously mentioned, the resulting aggregate rate was an Administrative Cost Allocation of 87% to M&I and 13% to AG.

The allocation resulted in a 1% decrease to M&I and subsequent 1% increase to AG in comparison to 2005-2006 and 2013-2014.

Recommendation

Staff respectfully recommends the Board consider the 2027-2028 Administrative Cost Allocation Study be performed in-house by staff for two reasons:

- 1) Performing a large-scale study every five years such as the one performed by Raftelis is not cost efficient and resulted in a very minimal impact to the overall percentage of allocation between the two affected divisions.
- 2) The 2022-2023 study did provide a framework for methodology to be used in future studies that is more robust than previously employed methodologies. Yet, staff can likely perform that analysis in an effective yet less costly manner.

Re: Duck Creek Headworks Automation Project

Background

As part of the 2022-2023 budget, the Board authorized \$65,000 for the Duck Creek Headworks Automation Project, which includes design, construction, flow measurement, and control automation. The purpose of the project is to replace the headworks gate and install a new flow control automated meter.

Summary

The proposed rehabilitation project is located north of Highway 4 on the Lower Farmington Canal. In addition to the ability to accurately measure and control flow, the project will provide the ability to monitor flow remotely and make real-time flow adjustments, thus decreasing repeated site visits for the Water Supply staff. A similar installation was successfully completed at Mosher Creek Headworks. Figure 1 shows the Mosher Creek Headworks SlipMeter.



Figure 1: Rubicon SlipMeter at Mosher Creek

The existing structure, which includes a manually operated canal gate, does not currently have flow measurement as shown in Figure 2. Flow measurement and flow control for this site is necessary for SB X7-7 compliance and for delivering water to Central San Joaquin Water Conservation District, respectively.



Figure 2: Duck Creek Headworks

District staff selected the Rubicon SlipMeter as the most appropriate flow control device because all the electronic equipment is out of the water, the measurement accuracy is within the range required by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, and the SlipMeter adjusts autonomously to maintain a flow, gate position, or water level set point. The District has also successfully installed and operated several other Rubicon products in the water supply system.

Financial Impact

The quoted cost for the single Rubicon SlipMeter, including installation supervision, commissioning, solar power and batteries, shipping, and tax is \$37,403. Purchase and installation of the equipment is expected to be within the approved budget.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to purchase one Rubicon SlipMeter in the amount of \$37,403, plus a 10% contingency, for a total approved amount of \$41,143 which is within the project budget of \$65,000.

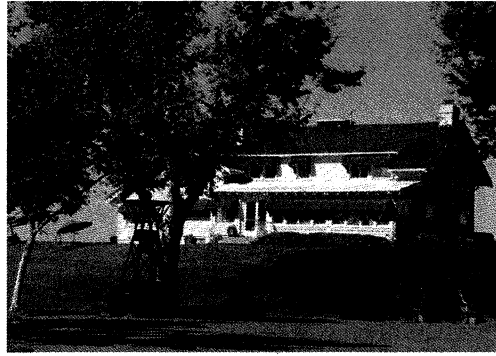



The California Special Districts Association (CSDA), representing approximately 1,200 independent special districts and affiliate organizations throughout the state, respectfully requests your signature on Senate Bill 656 (Eggman), related to the Stockton-East Water District and its water rates. CSDA represents special districts that provide millions of Californians with essential local services such as water, fire protection, sanitation, libraries and recreation and parks.

Severe, persistent drought conditions within the state of California continue to elevate the importance of the conservation efforts made by individuals as well as state and local agencies. Your administration recently called on water agencies throughout the state to increase efforts to reduce excessive water usage — a timely and poignant reminder of this fact. To that end, the Stockton-East Water District has maintained surface water rates below the maximum statutorily-allowed rate to encourage customers to use more surface water and pump less groundwater, protecting scarce water basins. Unfortunately, according to the district, the inflation-adjusted cap on the groundwater rates reduces the incentive for users to utilize surface water over groundwater. SB 656 would allow Stockton-East Water District to exceed their surface water rate and groundwater assessment caps, thereby allowing the district to enact more competitive water rates.

This legislation will enable the Stockton-East Water District to incentivize a transition away from scarce groundwater supplies to surface water. For these reasons, CSDA respectfully requests your signature on Senate Bill 656 (Eggman). Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

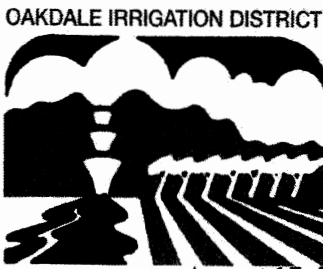

The San Joaquin Farm Bureau Federation is a non-profit, voluntary membership organization whose purpose is to protect and promote agricultural interests throughout San Joaquin County. Farm Bureau is San Joaquin County's largest farm organization, currently representing over 1,500 farm families and individual members. Farm Bureau strives to protect and improve the ability of farmers and ranchers engaged in production agriculture to provide a reliable supply of food and fiber through responsible stewardship of San Joaquin County's resources.

We are writing to support Senate Bill 656, a removal of a cap on the agricultural rates that can be charged by the Stockton East Water District (SEWD). Removing the rate cap would allow the district to raise funds to complete water projects that would keep them in compliance with the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). We would like to note that SB 656 would only remove the cap on agricultural rates that was established in 1971. Municipal rates would not be affected, and all existing rates would have to comply with existing laws.

Currently, the rates for SEWD are not sufficient to fund the various projects needed to achieve sustainability in the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Basin, and additional revenue is required. Existing funding and rates prevent SEWD from taking the actions needed to protect groundwater users and San Joaquin County as a whole.
