

Also present were Manager Moody, Assistant Manager Hopkins, Finance Director Vega, Administrative Services Manager Carido, Administrative Clerk Feliciano, Legal Counsel Zolezzi and Consultant Barkett. Director Cortopassi was absent.

4. Stockton East Water District – 2022 Water Rates

a. Public Hearing

President Watkins opened the Public Hearing at 12:34 p.m., to receive comments on the 2022 Water Rates and their associated Ordinance and Rule.

The District circulated notice of this public hearing in The Stockton Record on March 25, 2022 and did not receive any comments.

Seeing no public comment, President Watkins closed the Public Hearing at 12:38 p.m.

b. Ordinance No. 48

Manager Moody provided the Board with Ordinance No. 48 Establishing Municipal Groundwater Assessments, Agricultural Groundwater Assessments, Domestic Groundwater Assessments, Charges for Stream-Delivered Water and Charges for Out-of-District Water for Calendar Year 2022.

A motion was moved and seconded to adopt Ordinance No. 48 establishing municipal groundwater production assessment at \$386.37/AF (\$382.77/AF municipal groundwater rate equalization plus \$3.60/AF municipal groundwater assessment); agricultural groundwater assessment at \$5.79/AF; domestic unit assessment at \$49.00/domestic unit and agriculture surface water assessment at \$23.00/AF; out-of-district water contract price plus wheeling rate charge of up-to \$27.81/AF for Calendar Year 2022, as presented.

c. Rule No. 174

Manager Moody provided the Board with Rule No. 174 Rate Equalization – Calendar Year 2022. Manager Moody reported the Board must annually adopt a Rule establishing the rate equalization.

A motion was moved and seconded to adopt Rule No. 174 Rate Equalization-Calendar Year 2022 in the amount of \$382.77/AF.

5. Dr. Joe Waidhofer Drinking Water Treatment Plant – P27-Electric Motor Repair Memo, 04/05/22

Manager Moody provided the Board with a memo regarding the P-27 Electric Motor Repair. Assistant Manager Hopkins reported Staff recommended pump and motor rebuild of P-27 last year; this recommendation was based on observations made during the P-28 rebuild. Assistant Manager Hopkins reported the vibration analysis testing on P-27 came back showing no issues with the pump. Assistant Manager Hopkins reported damage to the bearings on the motor and impellers on the pump; Industrial Electric Company and Commercial Pump and Mechanical performed inspections and repairs to the P-27 pump and electric motor.

President Watkins inquired what year P-27 was installed. Assistant Manager Hopkins replied P-27 was installed in 2006. President Watkins calculated P-27 has been running continuously for ~9 years. President Watkins inquired about pump cavitation. Assistant Manager Hopkins replied it should not be a problem as the issue was previously identified and fixed. This item was for information only.

6. Executive Department State of California – Executive Order N-7-22 Well Permitting, 03/30/22  
Manager Moody provided the Board with correspondence regarding the Governor’s Executive Order on Well Permitting. Manager Moody reported the Governor signed an executive order stating Counties shall not approve new well permits without the approval of the Groundwater Sustainability Agency in a critically over drafted basin. Manager Moody reported discussion at the ACWA State Legislative Committee meeting regarding Assembly Bill 2201 which would make all new and existing well permits approved only by GSA’s permanent.

Director McGurk inquired about revoking the Executive Order. Legal Counsel Zolezzi stated once the drought is over the Governor no longer holds emergency powers. Discussion followed regarding the Executive Order pertaining to current pending well permits. Legal Counsel Zolezzi suggested a committee be formed to work with the County. Discussion followed regarding creating a committee and writing a policy for the GSA. Legal Counsel Zolezzi stated a formal committee recommendation will be distributed by the end of the week with the goal of the committee meeting next week.

## **E. COMMITTEE REPORTS**

1. Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Technical Advisory Committee Meeting, 03/31/22  
President Watkins and Manager Moody attended the March 31, 2022 Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Technical Advisory Committee Meeting. Manager Moody reported discussion regarding formulating the response and/or questions to present to the Department of Water Resources in reference to the substandard status of our GSP and how it can be addressed. President Watkins reported he pushed back on water quality, water quantity and subsidence; a critically over drafted basin must change the management objectives with curtailment to have a successful plan. President Watkins reported the County will be creating a subsidence program to look at critical infrastructure and use the State website to monitor the program. Discussion followed regarding subsidence. The next meeting is scheduled for April 14, 2022.
2. ACWA State Legislative Committee Meeting, 04/01/22



Manager Moody attended the April 1, 2022 ACWA State Legislative Committee Meeting. Manager Moody reported the Committee discussed ~30 Bills with the biggest concern being Assembly Bill 2201; the Bill would give GSA's the responsibility of approving all new and existing well permits in critically drafted basins; the Committee made the decision to oppose AB 2201. Manager Moody reported the Committee is following Senate Bill 1372 Stern regarding the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). Manager Moody reported discussion of an incident that occurred a month ago regarding an ACWA Staff member communicating the position taken by the Committee to the legislative author prior to the Committee discussion of the Bill; the Committee was upset by the situation. The next meeting is scheduled for April 29, 2022.

## **F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER**

### **1. Water Supply Report as of 04/04/22**

Manager Moody provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 132,091 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 29 cfs. Current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River are set at 1,277 cfs and release to all water users are set at 62 cfs. The water treatment plant is currently processing 40 mgd. The City of Stockton is currently processing 14 mgd.

### **3. Report on General Manager Activities**

#### **a. Stockton East Water District Activities Update**

Manager Moody reported the draft Evapotranspiration (ET) Study is complete; the numbers are very close to what is billed. Manager Moody stated there are a couple clarifying questions that need to be asked then the draft ET Study will be presented to the Board at a future Board Meeting. This item was for information only.

Manager Moody reported the District hosted an employee potluck on Friday, April 1<sup>st</sup>; the majority of Staff were present with the exception of those working on a project. Manager Moody stated it was the first potluck since the pandemic and it was nice to come together and share a meal. This item was for information only.

## **G. DIRECTOR REPORTS**

### **1. North San Joaquin Water Conservation District – District-Wide Groundwater Charge Discussion, 03/30/22**

Director Panizza, Manager Moody and Assistant Manager Hopkins attended the March 30, 2022 morning session of the North San Joaquin Water Conservation District – District-Wide Groundwater Charge Discussion and Director Sanguinetti attended the evening session of the North San Joaquin Water Conservation District – District-Wide Groundwater Charge Discussion. Director Sanguinetti reported discussion regarding the State taking over the Basin and the cost associated with that. Director Sanguinetti reported concern with the small owners and the amount they will have to pay; the payments will begin with \$15, \$20 and then to \$25. Director Panizza and Director Sanguinetti stated there were three board members present at each session; the board stated there are ~14,000 parcels in their district but they only service ~7,000 parcels. Director

Panizza reported the smaller owners with less than 5 acres would be exempt from groundwater charges. Director Panizza reported the presentation materials explained their process and actions well. This item was for information only.

## **BACKGROUND**

Stockton East Water District (District) plans to construct the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Disinfection System Project (Project) this fiscal year (FY) 22/23. The District is required to hire a consultant to handle Materials Testing and Special Inspections for the Disinfection System Project construction. On March 21, 2022, District Staff solicited quotes from four consultants: Terracon, Condor, Wallace Kuhl and RMA Group. Only two consultants provided quotes. Terracon provided the lowest quote for the scope of work at a price of \$49,274. The quotes are listed below:

## **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

The Materials Testing and Special Inspection Services were not included in previous project cost estimates provided by Carollo Engineers and exceed the Project budget. Staff proposes to postpone the Low Lift Pump Station Slide Gate Replacement and Automation Project to next FY and use part of the \$300,000 funding to supplement Project costs.

**RECOMMENDATIONS**

District Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to approve a Professional Services Agreement with Terracon to provide Materials Testing and Special Inspection Services for the Project in the amount of \$49,274, plus a 10% contingency of \$4,927, for a total of \$54,201, and make all other necessary approvals.

WHEREAS, LANDOWNER shall request, on an annual basis, non-potable agricultural water service (water) from DISTRICT for the Property; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT, on an annual basis, will determine(s) any availability of surplus water that may be available for use by the Property; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT and LANDOWNER intend by this agreement to confirm the terms and conditions under which water may be provided to the Property.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

So long as surplus water remains available to DISTRICT, DISTRICT will provide water for irrigation purpose to the Property, upon the same terms and conditions that it provides irrigation water to properties within the district boundaries, subject to any additional rules, regulations and charges that DISTRICT may adopt specifically for out-of-district properties.

2. Rules and Regulations. Water from DISTRICT is subject to DISTRICT rules and regulations, as adopted and modified from time to time, including all applicable charges, which may become due and payable regardless of whether or not water is used on the Property. LANDOWNER acknowledges that these rules and regulations include specific restrictions prohibiting land from taking water from the DISTRICT until the LANDOWNER has complied with the requirements of the Irrigated Lands Ag Waiver Program specific to the Property.

3. Water Use Efficiency. LANDOWNER shall demonstrate its overall irrigation efficiency on the Property and be able to achieve efficiency goals established by the District from time to time. The ability to achieve these efficiency goals will be evaluated by the District. The burden shall be on the Applicant(s) to prove that irrigation efficiency goals are maintained.

4. Rates. The Annual Charge for the receipt of water shall include: (1) an administration fee for the processing of this out-of-district account, and (2) payment of the water charges set annually by the DISTRICT Board of Directors prior to the start of the irrigation season. DISTRICT shall establish the estimated water use for the irrigation season prior to commencement of the irrigation season, and, as a condition of water service pursuant to this Agreement, Applicant shall deposit with DISTRICT fifty percent (50%) of the estimated water charges for the year prior to the commencement of water service pursuant to this Agreement. The remaining amounts owed by LANDOWNER shall be paid to the DISTRICT within thirty days (30) of billing.



5. Installation and Operation of Water Transportation Facilities. LANDOWNER agrees to install, operate and maintain the facilities necessary to transport said water from the DISTRICT water supply to the Property at LANDOWNER's sole cost and expense. The specific type, location and design of the facilities shall be approved in writing by DISTRICT prior to any construction, and all releases of water by DISTRICT shall be made by and through those transportation facilities. Following their installation, said facilities shall be operated and maintained by LANDOWNER. LANDOWNER shall, at all times, protect DISTRICT's canal or canals, ditch or ditches, waterway or waterways and the banks from destruction, damage or erosion resulting from the installation and operation of said improvements, and any and all such destruction, damage or erosion shall be repaired promptly and to the reasonable satisfaction of DISTRICT, at the expense of LANDOWNER. Upon termination of this Agreement, LANDOWNER agrees to pay all costs incurred with retiring any facilities that are no longer needed for water deliveries to the Applicant(s) as determined by the District.

6. Access Easement. LANDOWNER agrees to provide direct ingress and egress to the District's agents, vehicles and equipment during the term of this agreement.

7. Quality or Fitness of Water. DISTRICT makes no warranty or representations as to the quality or fitness for use of the water sold and provided to LANDOWNER pursuant to this Agreement. LANDOWNER shall be responsible for all necessary measures at its own expense for any testing, treatment, and other steps required for water sold pursuant to this Agreement.

8. Availability & Reduction in Water. The District makes no representation, guarantee or warranty to Applicant regarding the availability of surplus irrigation water or the quantity, quality, or delivery times of said water. Water delivered to LANDOWNER under this Agreement may be reduced by DISTRICT due to it becoming unavailable as determined by the DISTRICT, drought, failure of facilities, intervening acts, or any other actions beyond the control of DISTRICT.

9. No Assignment. The permission granted by this Agreement is personal and unassignable, and such permission constitutes a license only, irrevocable in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, and for the time period specified herein. This Agreement does not grant or create an easement, or does it convey or transfer to LANDOWNER any right, title or interest in or to any property of DISTRICT. LANDOWNER shall not assign this Agreement or attempt to assign the license created hereby and any such assignment or attempted assignment shall be void. Whenever this Agreement requires an act to be performed by LANDOWNER, such activity may be performed by LANDOWNER, its employees, agents, or persons or entities operating under a contract with LANDOWNER; provided that no contract or subcontract shall relieve LANDOWNER of any of its liabilities or obligations under this Agreement, and LANDOWNER agrees that it is fully responsible to DISTRICT for the acts and omissions of LANDOWNER's employees, agents, contractors, and subcontractors, and of persons either directly or indirectly employed by them in the performance of the activities.

10. Indemnification. This Agreement is made on the express condition that DISTRICT shall be free from all liability and claims for damages by reason of any injury to or death of any person, or persons, or damage to property of any kind whatsoever, arising out of or in any manner connected with this Agreement, DISTRICT's provision of water pursuant to this agreement, and/or with LANDOWNER's acts or omissions related to this Agreement. In this regard, LANDOWNER hereby agrees to and shall indemnify and hold harmless DISTRICT from and against any and all claims, damages, loss, liability and expenses, including court costs and attorneys' fees, arising out of or on account of injury to or death of any person or loss of or damage to any property as hereinabove mentioned.

11. Payment of District Expenses. LANDOWNER shall reimburse DISTRICT for all reasonable and direct costs incurred by it for legal, engineering, inspection, and other services in connection with the preparation of this Agreement, and other similar costs. The parties acknowledge that LANDOWNER has deposited Five-hundred Dollars (\$500.00) with DISTRICT toward this purpose.

12. Notice. All notices, requests, demands, and other communications which either party may require or desire to serve on the other under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be served (as an alternative to personal service) by registered or certified mail, with postage thereon fully prepaid, and addressed to the party so to be served as follows:


13. Amendments. This Agreement supersedes all prior negotiations of the parties hereto and contains the entire Agreement of such parties on the matters covered hereby. This Agreement may not be modified orally, or in any other manner, other than by an Agreement in writing signed by all of the parties hereto.

14. Permits and Government Approvals. LANDOWNER shall obtain all necessary County & Regulatory permits and governmental approvals required for their performance under this Agreement.

15. Term. This Agreement shall terminate upon 30-day notice of either the DISTRICT or the LANDOWNER.

16. Attorney's Fees. In the event of any controversy, claim, or dispute, relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the losing party reasonable expenses, attorney's fees and costs.

17. Counterparts. The parties may execute this Agreement in counterparts, which shall, in the aggregate, be signed by both parties; each counterpart shall be deemed an original instrument as against any party who has signed it. In the event of any disparity between the counterparts produced, the recorded counterpart shall be controlling.

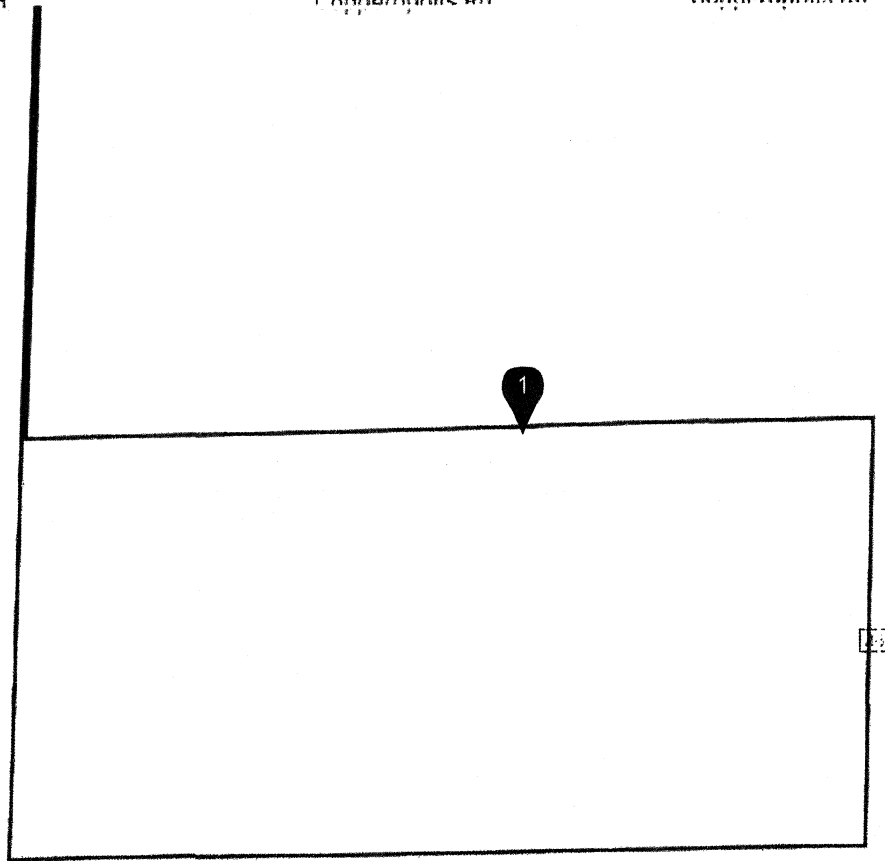

**Re: SB 656 (Eggman) – Stockton East Water District: water rate cap removal**

Dear Senator Eggman,


On behalf of Central San Joaquin Water Conservation District, I write in support of your bill, Senate Bill 656, which would remove a cap on the rates of Stockton East Water District to allow the District to raise revenues to comply with the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA).

SB 656 proposes to remove a legislative rate cap imposed solely upon agricultural rates in 1971. The legislation does not affect any other rates within the District, and would not make any changes to municipal rates. Importantly, any rate increases would be required to comply with California Law, including Proposition 218 and 26.

While virtually every other agricultural related Special District within the State of California has the ability to lawfully raise its groundwater extraction rates in compliance with State laws, Stockton East Water District is prohibited from doing so by archaic provisions in the legislation governing its operations. Such restrictions render the District unable to implement projects needed to achieve sustainability. My organization supports SB 656 to give Stockton East Water District's Board of Directors the ability to manage their organization appropriately and in compliance with SGMA for the benefit of the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Basin.

For these reasons, Central San Joaquin Water Conservation District is pleased to support Senate Bill 656. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.
