4. Ava Community Energy Presentation

Manager Hopkins introduced Juan Cortez and Alex DiGiorgio with Ava Community Energy (Ava). Mr. Cortez reported Ava Community Energy is a community choice power provider serving Alameda County and the cities of Lathrop, Stockton, and Tracy offering lower rates and renewable energy options. Beginning May of 2026, Ava will become the default provider of electric generation services for all eligible customers in unincorporated San Joaquin County. Mr. Cortez clarified that Ava provides generation service only, while PG&E will continue to own and operate transmission infrastructure and meters in our service area. After enrolling with Ava customers will continue get one monthly bill from PG&E, which will show electricity generation charges and credits from Ava. Mr. Cortez highlighted Ava’s benefits, including lower rates, local control and investment, sustainability, and customer choice programs.

5. Stockton East Water District – Staff Report – Consider Acceptance of Control Vault Electrical Improvements Project Completion

Manager Hopkins presented the Board with a Staff Report to Consider Acceptance of Control Vault Electrical Improvements Project Completion. Manager Hopkins reported the Control Vault Electrical Improvements Project located at the Dr. Joe Waidhofer Water Treatment Plant (WTP) was substantially completed by Bockmon & Woody Electric Co., Inc. on March 23, 2026, with final Project completion on March 27, 2026.

A motion was moved and seconded to approve the Project as complete and authorize the General Manager to proceed with signing of the Notice of Completion and file it with San Joaquin County Recorder’s Office, as presented.

E. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. San Joaquin Farm Bureau Federation Water Committee Meeting, 04/08/26

Water Supply Manager Donis attended the San Joaquin Farm Bureau Federation Water Committee Meeting. Water Supply manager Donis reported the committee received a presentation from Mary Hildebrand with the Great Valley Farm Water Partnership, who discussed water quality and water operations. He reported the committee received district reports from surrounding water districts.

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 04/07/26

Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 211,699 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 34 cfs. There is 1,861,078 AF in storage at New Melones Reservoir. Current releases are set at 1,520 cfs. The current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River is set at 1,527 cfs and release to all water users is set at 1,121 cfs. The District's Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is currently processing 32 mgd. The City of Stockton WTP is currently processing 10 mgd. The District groundwater production is currently 11 mgd.

3. Report on General Manager Activities

a. AMWA 2026 Water Policy Conference, 04/12/26 – 04/15/26

Manager Hopkins and Assistant Manager Vega attended the AMWA 2026 Water Policy Conference. Assistant Manager Vega reported the conference was very informative, with discussions focused on evolving dynamics and potential changes in power dynamics in Washington DC, noting the importance of staying aware of these developments as it pertains to carrying agency messages to legislators. He also reported insights on data centers, highlighting that a representative advocating for said data centers was very enthusiastic about the infrastructure required and the resources needed to support them.

b. ACWA State Legislative Committee Meeting, 04/17/26

Manager Hopkins introduced Kendra Daijogo from The Gualco Group who attended the ACWA State Legislative Committee Meeting. Ms. Daijogo reported on AB 1754, AB 2469, AB 2777, SB 952, SB 1313, SB 1326, and AB 2447. She also provided updates on the Committee Working Groups, which include Climate Bond, Emergency Management, Golden Mussels, Headwaters, Legislative Permit Streamlining, and Low-Income Rate Assistance.

c. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Kendra Daijogo from The Gualco Group provided the Board with a monthly lobbying update. Ms. Daijogo reported that State Legislators are returning for the second year of the 2025–2026 legislative session. She also provided updates on legislative and administrative priorities, as well as the Governor's divided focus and potential changes anticipated in 2027.

Manager Hopkins reported the District hired a new Electrical Technician named Zach Zamaroni.

Manager Hopkins reported this month that the District is featuring two new employees on its website and LinkedIn page. He reported the featured employees are Derrick Veldstra, Water Supply Operator I and Luis Perez-Luna, Maintenance Mechanic I.

Manager Hopkins reported that he met with Congressman Josh Harder's Office and learned that the District's primary supporter, Taylor Reed, has left the office and has not yet been replaced. Despite her departure, Congressman Harder's Office remains committed to supporting the District.

Manager Hopkins reported that he and Assistant Manager Vega met with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers administration. He noted that staff were very supportive and encouraging regarding the 203 process, which appears to be a viable path for the District.

Manager Hopkins provided the Board with the equipment use for the week of 04/13/26.

4. Stockton East Water District Operations Update
Water Operations Manager Wunderlich presented the Board with a WTP Update. Water Operations Manager Wunderlich reported, for March, staff collected 98 samples and there were 0 samples that tested positive for Coliform and E.coli. The rain totals for the past 30 days were 2.02 inches and the surface water production for the WTP was 3,293 AF and City of Stockton WTP was 987 AF. The groundwater production for Stockton East Water District was 500 AF, California Water Services was 161 AF and City of Stockton was 75 AF. Lastly, the TTHM average is 36 ppb and free chlorine average was 1.00 ppm.

G. DIRECTOR REPORTS

1. Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Board Meeting, 04/08/26
Director Panizza and Watkins attended the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Board Meeting. Director Panizza reported that the minutes were approved, next month's meeting was canceled, and the board voted to review the budget at the June meeting.
2. Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce – A Toast to Time, 04/09/26
Director Atkins and Watkins attended the Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce – A Toast to Time. Director Atkins reported that the event was very nice, and Supervisor Paul Canepa spoke about the 125 years of the Chamber of Commerce. He reported the Director of the Historical Society presented on the organization's history and origins. Additionally, awards were given to individuals who have been with the Chamber of Commerce for many years.
3. San Joaquin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Advisory Water Commission Meeting, 04/15/26
Director Atkins attended the San Joaquin Flood Control and Water Conservation District Advisory Water Commission Meeting. Director Atkins reported that Public Works provided an update on projects planned for FY 2026–27. The top priority project is the Redneck Creek at Dustin Road Culvert Replacement Project, with an estimated duration of two years. The second project is the Linden–Leaning Road at Berg Road Drainage Improvement Project, followed by the Gilt Creek Drainage Master Study.
4. 2026 SJCOG One Voice Kick Off Meeting, 04/16/26
Director McGurk, Nakaue, Sanguinetti, and Watkins attended the 2026 SJCOG One Voice Kick Off Meeting. The meeting consisted of a discussion on what to expect at the upcoming SJCOG One Voice Trip.

SUBJECT: Consider Award of Contract for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 for ACH/P after Second Round of Bid Proposals

Executive Summary

The District annually procures treatment chemicals for the Dr. Joe Waidhoffer Water Treatment Plant through a competitive bidding process. Following the initial Fiscal Year 2026–2027 bid opening on March 2, 2026, the Board approved contracts with the lowest bidders on March 17, 2026. However, for the ACH/P coagulant, both the selected vendor and the only other bidder failed to provide required laboratory documentation demonstrating compliance with specifications, necessitating rejection of both bids and re-advertisement.

Upon review, staff determined that the original ACH/P specifications were overly restrictive and revised them to maintain treatment effectiveness while allowing broader vendor participation. The re-bid resulted in three responsive bids, all of which met the updated requirements. The lowest bidder remained unchanged from the original solicitation.

The re-bid does not impact the overall projected chemical costs. Estimated total chemical expenditures for FY 2026–2027 are \$1,941,796, which is within the approved budget of \$2,200,000.

Staff recommends that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute a Chemical Vendor Agreement with Chemtrade for ACH/P. Additionally, staff recommends authorizing the General Manager or designee to procure chemicals from other qualified bidders, if necessary, to address emergencies or performance issues.

Background

The District solicits Chemical Services Bids during the first quarter of each year to establish chemical supply contracts for the upcoming fiscal year for use in the Dr. Joe Waidhoffer Water Treatment Plant’s (WTP) water treatment process. The District recently released a request for bids for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 and the bid opening was held on March 2, 2026, at 2:00 pm. The list of chemicals, and their uses, which are yearly included in this bid effort are listed in **Table 1**.

Chemical	Uses
5% Acidified Alum	Used as a water coagulant. Added to water to help remove suspended particles and create clumps or "floc" which settles and is removed from water.
Caustic Soda	Primarily used to raise PH of water. Certain processes such as coagulation and disinfection work better within a specific PH range, but used at WTP for corrosion control.
PACI	Used as a water coagulant. Can work in a wider PH range and at lower dosages. Effective at reducing turbidity (cloudiness) which is important for the District during and after storm events.
ACH/P	Used as a water coagulant. Especially effective with low to medium turbidity levels
Sodium Hypochlorite	Disinfection agent used to kill bacteria, viruses, and other microorganisms. Helps oxidize contaminants in water. Reduces/controls algae growth.

Table 1. Chemicals used in WTP

On March 17, 2026 Chemical Bid results were shared with the Board and the Board approved Vendor Agreements with the lowest bidders. Each winning bidder had until April 14, 2026 to provide laboratory reports indicating compliance with the District's bid documents and a signed Chemical Vendor Agreement and Public Notice (of Acutely Hazardous Material). In the case of the winning bidder and the only other bidder for ACH/P, neither vendor was able to provide laboratory reports that showed compliance with the bid documents. As such, both bids had to be rejected, and the chemical contract for ACH/P had to be re-bid.

Summary

Upon analyzing the chemical requirements specified in the bid package for ACH/P, Staff realized that the requirements were too narrow and that such requirements could be expanded while maintaining desired effectiveness. Thus, the parameters for ACH/P were adjusted and the bid package was once again posted on Planet Bids. The District received 3 bids as can be seen in **Table 2**. All 3 vendors provided lab reports showing the ability to produce the required chemical within the required specifications in the revised bid package.

Financial Impact

The winning bidder and winning bid amount were unchanged from the March 27, 2026 item that was presented to the Board, which means the re-bid offered no new estimated budget impact. Based on the lowest bids, and projected chemical demand, the estimated 2026-2027 fiscal year total chemical cost is \$1,941,796. The approved 2026-2027 fiscal year budget includes \$2,200,000 of funding and is therefore anticipated to be sufficient for water treatment plant chemical purchases.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to approve Chemical Vendor Agreement with Chemtrade. Additionally, in case of emergency or lack of performance by Chemtrade, Staff further recommends the Board of Directors authorize the General Manager (or his designee) to approve emergency orders from another responsible bidder on the list at the lowest possible price.
