Manager Hopkins presented the Board with a Staff Report to Consider Removal of Stone Columns and Pipe Piles under RCP, Steel Pipe, and Flow Meter Vaults Away from Weir at Bellota Weir Modifications Project. Assistant Manager Vega reported the Bellota Weir Modifications’ Project currently under construction by Shimmick Construction under a contract valued at \$50,630,000 (plus 20% contingency). He reported during the construction, District staff, HDR, and Shimmick

evaluated opportunities to reduce project costs while maintaining appropriate risk management standards.

2. Stockton East Water District – Staff Report – Direction from the Board of Directors on Application of \$12.3 Million Department of Water Resources Grant for the Bellota Weir Modification Project

Manager Hopkins presented the Board with a Staff Report to receive Direction from the Board of Directors on Application of \$12.3 Million Department of Water Resources Grant for the Bellota Weir Modification Project. Manager Hopkins reported the Stockton East Water District (SEWD) has been awarded a \$12.3 million grant from the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) in connection with the Bellota Weir Modification Project. He reported the Project has a revised total estimated cost of \$73 million, allocated among the District's M&I, Recharge, and Agricultural (AG) customer classes based on a 2023 cost allocation study prepared by Raftelis.

Director McGurk, Nakaue and Sanguinetti inquired about the staff report and staff provided responses to the questions.

Manager Hopkins presented the Board with a Staff Report for Consideration of Adopting Policy No. 6700, Wage Retention (Y-Rating) Policy, Establishing a Formal Wage Retention Framework for District Employees. Manager Hopkins reported the policy establishes a formal, consistent framework for retaining the base salary of employees whose pay exceeds the maximum of the salary range for their position as a result of a reclassification, reorganization, salary survey adjustment, position elimination, or voluntary acceptance of a lower-classified position to avoid layoff.

E. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Ad-Hoc Board Ethical Guidelines Review and Update Committee Meeting, 04/29/26
Director Hansen, Nakaue and Sanguinetti along with Manager Hopkins attended the Ad-Hoc Board Ethical Guidelines Review and Update Committee Meeting. Director Nakaue reported that the committee discussed the definition of what constitutes a meeting and how directors should be compensated. He reported the committee will be reviewing a draft resolution related to Board and District procedures and organization.

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 05/19/26
Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 208,959 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 174 cfs. There is 1,834,070 AF in storage at New Melones Reservoir. Current releases are set at 2,349 cfs. The current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River is set at 2,439 cfs and release to all water users is set at 2,749 cfs. The District's WTP is currently processing 34 mgd. The City of Stockton WTP is currently processing 26 mgd. The District groundwater production is currently 8 mgd.

3. Report on General Manager Activities
 - a. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Manager Hopkins reported that staff met with the State Water Board regarding the SRF loan. He reported the State Water Board visited the project site at the Bellota Weir, as the District is moving toward completion of the loan process.

Manager Hopkins reported water quality continues to remain within regulatory standards. He reported the District responded to a large data request from the Division of Drinking Water last week, and staff is working to complete a separate data request for California Water Service Company.

Manager Hopkins reported the Farmington Reservoir Project aired on “Inside the Blueprint” this past Saturday and will air again this Saturday, May 30, at 8:30 a.m. He reported the segment will also air on “Bloomberg”, although the date has not yet been determined.

Manager Hopkins provided the Board with the equipment use for the week of 05/18/26.

4. Stockton East Water District Finance Update

Director of Finance and Administration Ram provided the Board with a Finance and Administration update. Director of Finance and Administration Ram reported for the month of April, California Class A investment income totaled \$85,350. She reported LAIF earnings will be reported to the Board in July, as LAIF reports investment earnings on a quarterly basis. Director of Finance and Administration Ram reported staff transferred \$10 million from California Class to LAIF due to improved earnings performance. She reported California Class is currently earning approximately 3.69%, while LAIF is earning approximately 3.81%. She also reported staff continue to work through the Tyler Technologies conversion process, with assistance from Verve IT in formatting data.

Director of Finance and Administration Ram reported administrative staff is working on finalizing the ACWA JPIA Wellness Grant Application for 2026–2027. She reported staff is currently preparing for the upcoming San Joaquin County elections and that the District will be hosting the Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce Networking Mixer. Director of Finance and Administration Ram further reported that the annual Fire Department inspection was completed with no corrective action required. She also reported the ADA inspection has been completed, with the report still pending. Lastly, she reported implementation of the new Safety Management System is underway to improve training, reporting, and hazard tracking.

G. DIRECTOR REPORTS

1. 2026 State of the City, 05/20/26

Directors Atkins, Sanguinetti and Watkins along with Manager Hopkins and Administrative Assistant Barraza attended the 2026 State of the City. Director Sanguinetti reported Mayor Fugazi gave a speech at the event. Director Watkins reported the videos presented were enjoyable to watch and that the food, which was prepared by the arena, was very good. Director Atkins reported it was a nice event and preferable to hosting it at the port, as the venue was air-conditioned.

2. San Joaquin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Advisory Water Commission Meeting, 05/20/26

Director Atkins attended the San Joaquin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Advisory Water Commission Meeting. Director Atkins reported the committee discussed a regulatory fee proposal for Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) compliance with County Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA) No. 1 in the Eastern San Joaquin Subbasin, a regulatory fee proposal for SGMA compliance with the County GSA in the Tracy Subbasin, the San Joaquin County Drought Resilience Plan update, and the Fall 2025 Groundwater Monitoring Report. He further reported the committee received staff reports from the San Joaquin Area Flood Control Agency and San Joaquin County Public Works.

3. 2026 Bay-Delta Water Tour Dinner, 05/20/26
Director Atkins and Watkins along with Manager Hopkins and Legal Counsel Zolezzi attended the 2026 Bay-Delta Water Tour Dinner. Director Atkins reported it was a nice event with a smaller group in attendance. He reported the District’s legal counsel, Jeanne Zolezzi, spoke at the dinner on behalf of the District.
4. Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Ad-Hoc Executive Committee Meeting, 05/21/26
Director Watkins attended the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Ad-Hoc Executive Committee Meeting. Director Watkins reported the committee received updates on the 52 wells. He reported they are on track to spend the \$2.1 million in ARPA/ARRO funding and there are two new wells planned. He stated construction on the first well is expected to begin in mid-June, with the second well anticipated to begin later in the month. Director Watkins also reported that there were no changes to the budget and that the item will be presented to the Board in June.

TITLE: High Service Pump Station HVAC Improvements and Redundant Cooling System

SUBJECT: Consider approval of HVAC system modifications and redundant cooling system at High Service Pump Station and Proposed Budget Amendment

Executive Summary

The Stockton East Water District's (District) High Service Pump Station (HSPS) is a critical facility responsible for delivering water to municipal and industrial customers. Existing HVAC deficiencies have been identified and resulted in elevated room temperatures, inadequate cooling performance, and lack of system redundancy—conditions that pose a significant operational risk to essential equipment and continuous service.

Despite relatively new equipment, the current HVAC system reflects only a partial implementation of the original design and is unable to maintain required temperature thresholds. This has already led to operational impacts, including high-temperature trips, and increases the risk of equipment failure and service disruption.

To address these issues, staff proposes a two-part project: (1) remediation of existing HVAC performance through airflow improvements, upgraded controls, and enhanced air circulation; and (2) installation of a new 20-ton package unit to provide redundant cooling capacity. These improvements will restore system performance, improve reliability, and reduce operational risk at this critical facility.

District staff recommends that the Board of Directors (Board):

1. Authorize the General Manager to proceed with implementing the HVAC system improvements and installation of a redundant cooling system at the High Service Pump Station in the amount of \$302,801 plus 10% contingency of \$30,280 for a total of \$333,081 and execute all appropriately necessary agreements.
2. Approve the required budget transfer presented in **Table 1**.

Background

The High Service Pump Station is a critical facility supporting continuous water delivery to key M&I customers. Maintaining proper environmental conditions within the building is essential to ensure reliable performance of electrical equipment, motors, drives, and control systems.

The District previously pursued HVAC improvements for this facility in response to increased room temperatures associated with station operations and added heat load. Kennedy/Jenks' 2022 design assistance proposal stated that the District observed a significant increase in room temperature associated with the VFD upgrades and sought recommendations to maintain the room temperature at a maximum of 80 degrees Fahrenheit.

The subsequent design prepared by Keller Associates for the heating and cooling upgrades included three air conditioning units set up so one unit runs first and the others come on as needed, a single thermostat to control the system, communication capability for future connection to the District's monitoring system, insulated ductwork, new wall openings, return air plenum modifications, and required testing and balancing.

The existing HVAC system includes three of the four recommended 20-ton units that are approximately two years old. While the units themselves are relatively new, the overall system is not achieving the desired cooling performance. The current installation reflects only a partial implementation of the broader original design intent. As a result, the facility continues to experience elevated room temperatures.

Staff has confirmed that the HVAC package units associated with this scope use variable-frequency-drive controls, not RVSS starters or across-the-line starting. This distinction should be considered during electrical review because it affects starting current and staged operation of the cooling units. In addition, the current configuration does not provide sufficient redundancy. If one unit is offline or underperforming, the remaining units cannot maintain adequate cooling throughout the facility. Given the critical nature of HSPS, this represents an elevated operational risk.

Summary

The proposed project consists of two primary components:

1. HVAC Performance Remediation

Improvements will address the root causes of the current cooling deficiencies and include:

- Ductwork modifications and installation of backdraft dampers
- Air balancing and redistribution of supply and return airflow
- Installation of six (6) industrial ceiling fans to improve air circulation
- Replacement of existing thermostats with upgraded digital controls utilizing return air sensing
- Continuous fan operation to better manage internal heat load

These improvements are intended to restore proper airflow, improve temperature control, and increase the effectiveness of the existing HVAC system. American Chiller's remediation proposal specifically includes ductwork modifications, backdraft dampers, air balancing, six industrial ceiling fans, removal of existing thermostats, and new digital temperature controls for continuous fan operation and improved space control.

2. Redundant Cooling System Installation

- Installation of a new 20-ton package unit with economizer
- Reconfiguration of ducting and concrete pad to support equipment layout
- Electrical modifications to allow parallel operation of units
- Installation of backdraft dampers to allow simultaneous and independent unit operation
- Air balance testing, startup, and commissioning

This work will provide redundant cooling capability and improve the facility's ability to maintain acceptable room temperatures if one unit is unavailable or underperforming. American Chiller's installation proposal includes adding a new 20-ton package unit, reconfiguring ducting and concrete pad layout, providing parallel electrical feeds, installing backdraft dampers, and completing startup and air balance testing.

The proposed improvements are generally consistent with the broader intent of the original HVAC upgrade design.

3. Risk Considerations

Failure to address the current HVAC deficiencies will continue to expose the District to the risk of overheating critical equipment at the HSPS.

This risk is already materializing, as evidenced by multiple high-temperature trips of Pump P-29. Continued operation under elevated temperatures increases the likelihood of equipment damage, unplanned outages, and service disruptions.

Because HSPS is the District's only pump station serving M&I customers, any failure at this facility would have immediate and significant impact on water delivery for the City of Stockton and California Water Service.

The lack of redundancy further increases this risk by leaving the facility vulnerable if any single HVAC unit becomes inoperable.

4. Procurement

The District solicited quotes from multiple qualified vendors. Including Comfort Air, McLaughlin Air, and American Chiller Service Inc. However, American Chiller Service Air was the only vendor to provide a complete proposal based on field evaluation and job walk.

The proposed scope addresses both the current cooling deficiencies and the need for redundant cooling capacity at this critical facility.

On April 22, 2026 the Municipal Operations Committee reviewed this staff report and requested Staff looking into the feasibility and viability of using a heat pump system to cool the HSPS. The following is the result of that investigation:

Staff engaged with the contractors as requested by the Board of Directors to evaluate the alternate plant-water/heat-pump-style cooling concept. Based on that feedback, the concept may be technically viable, but would require engineering, redesign, and further cost development before a reliable lifecycle cost comparison could be completed. Additionally, there is a "sunk" cost of \$266,120 associated with the previous work already completed at the HSPS site. Therefore, Staff recommends proceeding with the proposed pump room HVAC modifications and fourth-unit approach because it provides the most immediate, defined, and cost-effective path to address the current cooling concerns.

Financial Impact

The District has received proposals for the following work:

- HVAC Performance Remediation: \$130,616
- 20-Ton Package Unit Installation: \$172,185

Total Project Cost: \$302,801 plus 10% contingency of \$30,280 for a total of \$333,081

The District's Board approved Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget includes \$200,000 for this work, but the estimated cost at budget formulation is short of the received proposals. As such a budget amendment such as the one presented in Table 1. Is necessary to complete the proposed work.

After analyzing priorities, staff believes that the HSPS temperature issue is much more critical than Phase I of the HVAC work for the Low Lift Pump Station which will be moved to a different fiscal year. The electrical work for the 120/208V distribution and feeder replacements can continue in a more limited scope and can be supplemented if necessary from the general maintenance funds.

Staff Recommendation

District staff recommends that the Board:

1. Authorize the General Manager to proceed with implementing the HVAC system improvements and installation of a redundant cooling system at the High Service Pump Station in the amount of \$302,801 plus 10% contingency of \$30,280 for a total of \$333, 081 and execute all appropriately necessary agreements.
2. Approve the required budget transfer presented in **Table 1**.

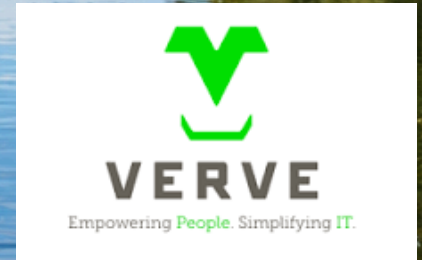
